The Great Outdoors

"Uh, uh, Ms. Noor!" Ayub called out. "I heard a bird, it goes ooh hoo hoo hoo. I used to know, Ms. Mary told me what it is called! Oh, I can't remember the name. There it is again. No, not that one. Listen! Do you, do you hear it?"

Tuesday is birding day, and Ayub is giddy with excitement. As soon as he can, Ayub slings a pair of binoculars around his neck and runs towards the door. He can't wait to get outside to see what he can find. Ms. Mary, our birding volunteer, has repeatedly expressed her amazement at Ayub's eyesight and how quickly he recognizes different species. He is not only the most *excited* birder in the group, but by far the most *gifted*.

Ayub is a seventh grader whose parents are from Ethiopia. Basic math facts are hard for Ayub to master and writing is a challenge – but this kid *thrives* in the outdoors.

On Wednesdays, when Ms. Noor leads a group of students to the woodland behind the church, Ayub is her most dedicated participant. His curiosity to explore has sparked an interest in trail building. He doesn't complain (much) about the mosquitoes. He jumps right in -- pruning back vines and raking leaves to help the woods become more inviting and accessible for everyone.

The Great Outdoors continued...

On the second Saturday of every month, Ayub gets himself out of bed at 6 AM (three hours early, just to be sure he doesn't oversleep!) and waits for his ride to attend the Atlanta Urban Ecologists. This program explores the rich ecology of the metro area, and Ayub is one of eight Inspire students who participated this year. Students have planted trees, conducted a nighttime search for amphibians, learned about beavers, eaten insect snacks, and canoed down the Chattahoochee River. Ayub is thrilled about all that he has learned, like how to recognize natural species, describe wind patterns, and see the effects of weather on natural areas (he now notices the new paths made by water after a storm!).

One of the goals of Inspire is to expose students to new experiences and to help them explore areas of interest they might not have otherwise encountered. Ayub has benefited immensely from the opportunities he's had to be in contact with nature this year at Inspire. Having time in the outdoors has offered him regular opportunities to achieve and to develop confidence and self esteem. While Ayub spends most of his day in an academic setting - where he doesn't feel that he belongs and where his strengths don't shine - Inspire gives him an opportunity to be in a different setting, one where he thrives and can feel proud of his accomplishments.

In January 2017, President Trump passed an executive order which soon became known as the "travel ban." We created space at our program for students to think about, discuss, and respond to this. As refugees themselves, our students had many thoughts that they wanted to share. They created protest signs they wished to hold up at the airport protests (see Protest Paper Doll Chain – Love Trumps Hate on youtube) stating things like "outside people matter" and "America is the land for ALL." They wrote letters to President

Trump [yes, we actually sent them! (and are still awaiting a response)] that said things like: "My family came here because there is a war in my country," "We are grateful to be in this country because we have a better life and it is safer," "We want to give back to this country by welcoming people and making less racism," and "My family and I hope that we don't have to go back." Our students also decided they wanted to create a video to share with the world about why they think this country should continue to welcome refugees. Search Refugees
