#### **Inspired to Continue Impacting the Inspire Community**

The year 2020 has been a year filled with fear, uncertainty, hopelessness, stress, and unexpected outcomes. Amid the traumatic experiences taking place around the world, there has been some relief and light at the end of the tunnel as we close out the year. Some of us learned new ways of living and being while others simply survived the year...which is more than enough. At Inspire, we both learned new ways to engage our community and WE SURVIVED THE YEAR 2020! We learned just how flexible we are when we adjusted our program services without time to prepare and served our Inspire community based on their highest priority needs. This year we were able to continue our mission and reflect what it means to provide holistic development. We were challenged to operate outside of our normal program services and find unique and impactful ways to care for our community.

Given the COVID-19 circumstances, Inspire only planned to remain in regular communication with our students and families remotely through verbal and virtual check-ins. We pushed our limits starting back in April and were able to reassess the community needs, make sure students received printed homework material and provided school supplies to address the limited access to technology and supplies needed to complete virtual learning assignments. We provided snacks and supplemental food support information and delivery to address food insecurity, and face masks for students and family members to minimize infection and spread of COVID-19. During the fall semester of the 2020-2021 school year, we provided technology assistance to students to ensure everyone received a school-issued computer and gained access to virtual learning content at home. We began our first virtual tutoring service which offered weekly homework support to students from volunteers. We launched a new partnership with Glenn Memorial United Methodist Church, joining their Snack in a Backpack program to provide weekly pick-up and delivery services of shelf stable and fresh food to all current Inspire students and their families including some alumni students. Also, we provided regular deliveries of school supplies, personal protective equipment (PPE) and COVID-19 education to students and their families. These activities allowed us to stay connected to the Inspire community as planned and we safely stretched our limits to do as much as possible with the resources available. [continued on back...]
