Students, parents, and teachers were all uncertain about how school would go during COVID, given that the previous school year ended abruptly with many unknowns for the future. We've begun virtual learning this year, which is a new experience for all of us. Although it isn't the best, we managed to adapt to this new way of life for our education.

For almost three years, I've been a student at Inspire. To say my time here was wonderful would be an understatement. I've gained a lot of useful things and met several incredible people. In sixth grade, we went to the Atlanta Science Festival, which was one of my favorite experiences. The trip taught me a lot of new things and introduced me to new people who informed me much about their professions. Going to see plays was another highlight of my first year at Inspire. These trips were not only entertaining but also educational. They've taught me things that I'm sure will come in handy in the future. Unfortunately, I didn't get to spend the entirety of my seventh-grade year at Inspire, not just because I arrived late, but also due to COVID's takeover.

Covid has taught me how to adjust to a variety of situations. Most people, including myself, were initially ecstatic about the prospect of taking a few days off from school. We had no idea that things would never be the same after that. We didn't do anything from home at the end of last school year because the teachers and staff, like us, were unprepared. This school year, though, we all had to adjust to online learning. The thing about online learning is that I don't believe it has had the same impact on students as it would if we were in the same room. Some students need more visualization and movement in order to understand. Some people just don't have the best resources or living conditions, making online education less than ideal. The great thing about Inspire is that, in my view, everyone can be who they want to be and no one judges them for it. Everyone is different and special in their own way, and the people here assist us in understanding and embracing our differences. I just can't talk about Inspire without mentioning the fantastic support group. Everyone there is so helpful, friendly, and supportive. The Inspire activities are also fantastic because they encourage children to try new sports or activities. Every Tuesday, for example, we had Ultimate Frisbee, which was my favorite. I had never known how to properly throw a frisbee, let alone play it, but it was one of my favorite things I learned during my time at Inspire. My first year at Girls on the Run (GOTR) was also last year. GOTR is a non-profit organization that works to improve women's social, physical, and emotional skills in preparation for future or current life experiences. It was not only entertaining, but it also allowed me to meet new people, including the wonderful and welcoming GOTR coaches.

Finally, finding a new leader each year is one of the highlights of my time here. My first year here, and meeting Ms. Natalie was pretty amazing. Last year, during my second year of Inspire, I met Ms. Teni-Ola, but our time together was cut short due to quarantine. I had the opportunity to join virtual tutoring classes with Ms. Charity during my final year here. They may not realize it, but they all mean a lot to me, and I admire them for what they do. It takes a lot of time and patience to support children in general. I'm not sure how difficult this task is, but they make it appear to be easy, so they must be doing something right. I really thank the volunteers and anyone who has come in to assist with events, including The Paideia School squad, soccer coaches, GOTR coaches, guitar instructor, and everyone else who has given up time out of their day to help others.
